LOCAL VALUE

Smoky Hills PBS is a valuable asset to Central and Western Kansas, which is comprised of primarily rural

communities. Many residents depend on broadcast television because of their rural location. For some, Smoky Hills PBS is the only channel they receive.



In addition to programming, our services include the distribution of books to children, as well as schools and libraries across Central and Western Kansas.

FY2022 Key Services

Smoky Hills PBS engaged with Kansas citizens in 71 counties through broadcast of local programming, more LIVE stream options, Family Fun Day events, Share A Story programs, and our annual PBS KIDS Writers Contest.

Local Impact

With a broadcast signal that covers most of the Western half of Kansas, Smoky Hills PBS connects Central and Western Kansas residents with commercial-free broadcasting, a 24/7 kids channel, a CREATE channel, and a LIVE TV button where viewers can watch our station LIVE any time.

NEW General Manager

Smoky Hills PBS welcomed a new General Manager, Betsy Schwien. She brings management and leadership experience to the organization and is committed to helping grow and expand on the services that our communities have come to rely on for education, engagement, and entertainment.

Equipment Upgrade

In February 2021 Smoky Hills PBS suffered a broken water pipe during the extreme and frigid weather conditions. The water damage left Smoky Hills PBS' broadcast equipment damaged.

In March of 2022, we were excited to announce that a rebuild of the broadcast equipment was going to be possible, replacing the damaged equipment caused by the broken water pipe.

The rebuild replaced every aspect of video encoding and broadcasting along with a new automation system. With this new system, Smoky Hills PBS and its viewers see an increase in the audio quality and picture quality.

This rebuild would not have been possible without our viewer's support! Without them, these repairs would not have been possible!

were **374** kids in attendance and each child went home with a FREE book.

In the Spring, we headed to the Great Bend Zoo for an Earth Day Celebration. We handed out FREE books to **463** kids in attendance!

tives and Senators discussing state issues, taking place during the legislative session. It also allows viewers a chance to call in with questions for their state representatives.



Smoky Hills PBS had LIVE coverage of Father Kapaun's vigil service and funeral on Sept. 28th & 29th. Our viewers were very appreciative of this coverage. It was a very monumental moment for the state of Kansas! We also offered a rebroadcast of this coverage in October.

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Literacy Initiative

Ensuring all children within our viewing area have the educational resources they need is an important mission of Smoky Hills PBS. The more a child reads and is read to, the more likely they are to read for enjoyment. Throughout FY22, we provided many opportunities for kids to receive FREE books and encourage them to read and write!

First Book Club

In fiscal year 2022, Smoky Hills PBS distributed **7,968** books to children throughout our viewing area. These books were given to children during their school day, in partnership with the Kansas Head Start program and public preschools. Books are also given to teachers to use as part of their curriculum. Read below on how our First Book Club program makes a difference for not only children, but teachers as well.

It has been a wonderful surprise for the students at Dighton Preschool to receive books from Smoky Hills Public Television that they can take home and read with their families. We are a Title I school and most of our students families do not have the means to purchase new or used books from Scholastic or book fairs that they can keep at home. This past year we have included the books sent to us in our classroom lessons. Last spring during our butterfly unit we used *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* when discussing the life cycle of a butterfly. This fall we used the book *The Day I Forgot to Wash My Hands* when we did our five senses unit and learning how to correctly wash our hands. We also look for the letters we have learned in class on the cover of the book and while reading it to see if we can find them. Before sending the books home, we read them together as a class several different times. This gives the child an opportunity to learn about the book and so we can answer any questions they might have. Notes are also sent home with the book to inform parents where the book came from and the importance of having someone read to them not only at school but at home as well.

Each time the students have received a new book from Smoky Hills Public Television they are given an opportunity to engage in the reading with their parents and siblings and learn to love reading at a young age. The books that we are able to send home with students would not have been possible without Smoky Hills Public Television taking an interest in our students learning. For Smoky Hill Public Television to receive a grant in which they make a difference in the lives of young kids learning to read is a great asset to our area.

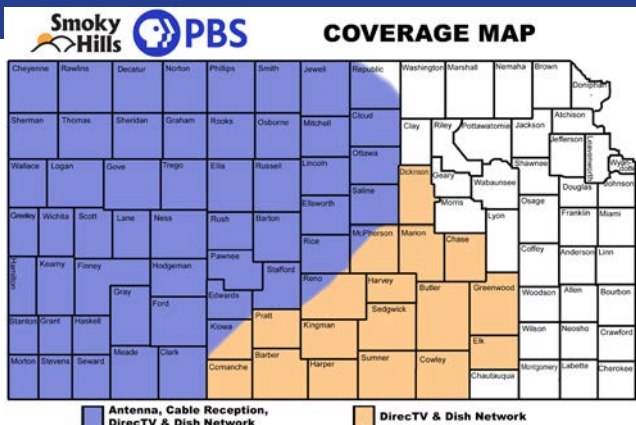
