
Season 3 and 4


DOLLY MADISON

Dolly Madison bakery in Great Bend, Kansas. Twenty years later, a filmmaker finds there might be hidden reasons as to why it has remained unsolved for so long.

First Book Club


In FY24, Smoky Hills PBS distributed **6,557 FREE books** to children throughout our viewing area. These books were given to children enrolled in public preschools and Head Start programs during their school



day. This is made possible because of our partnership with many foundations throughout our coverage area. The FREE books are also used by teachers as part of their curriculum.

Share A Story

During the summer of 2024, we traveled throughout our coverage area visiting libraries and encouraging children to read! This year's theme was Nature Cat.

During the Share A Story program, our presenters follow the Learning Triangle below:

- 1. **READ IT** Read a PBS KIDS book.
- 2. WATCH IT Watch a PBS KIDS show related to the book.
- 3. **DO IT** Put together a craft.

Each child in attendance received a FREE book! We were able to distribute **1,252** books to 77 libraries within our viewing area.

Literacy Initiative Continued





The PBS KIDS Writers Contest was an annual event that encouraged children to write and illustrate their own stories! In FY24, we adjusted the age group to 1st-5th

grade and saw an increase in stories. This year we received 150 stories from children across our viewing area! The top 3 stories in each age group were chosen by our judges. The winning stories were then read and announced on-air. These winners received books and prizes in the mail!




